



Komomaki (Straw Belts)

Komomaki are not used to protect trees from the cold. During winter, the larvae of harmful insects - known as pine moths - burrow into the komomaki. Then, in early spring, before the larvae become active, the komomaki are removed, and the harmful insects are thus gotten rid of along with them.
